Dear Parents,

This year we continue to emphasise the importance of children reading both in school and at home. In school, children will spend 15 minutes of each day, reading within one of their lessons. The school will continue to follow a reading programme called Accelerated Reader. This involves carefully assessing and tracking your child's reading as they move through colour coded book levels. After reading a book, children are asked to take a quiz in order for us to monitor their understanding and progress. Children will receive points for their quizzes and will achieve prizes for their points. We would like to ask for your assistance with encouraging children to read at home.

Pupils will use their planner as a reading record which they should take home and bring to school each day, along with a book that they have been given from the library. The nature of Accelerated Reader is building children's confidence in reading. Please don't be alarmed if initially you feel your child is reading a book that is too easy, the programme will allow us to move pupils through the book levels as swiftly as is needed.

We ask that children read at home at least 4 times per week. This may involve pupils reading independently or reading to an adult or sibling and spending time discussing the book. Each day that your child reads with someone or you witness them reading independently, we ask that you could you sign their planner with the book they have read as evidence.

In order to track children's reading, we will be completing a reading register in school each day where pupils will say whether they have read the previous evening. In addition to this, their planners will be checked on a weekly basis. As this is set as homework, children who do not read four times will be asked to attend homework club for 30 minutes during one lunchtime to catch up on valuable reading time.

Thank you for the support you are able to provide by listening to your child read regularly, signing their planner and encouraging them to work towards achieving their rewards, as well as understanding the benefits of reading.
