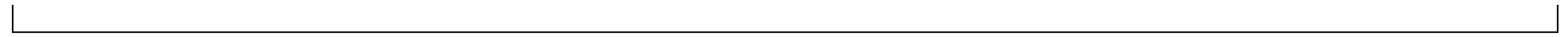


## Governor Information and Pen Portrait
